Discussion was made by Mike Gallamore explaining the need for the rate increase to help pay for certain extension and improvements to the town's waterworks utility.

Election of Officers was held. Past Vice President Mike Gallamore asked for nominations. Troy Meadows nominated Greg Nelson for president; Philip Montarsi seconded the nomination and passed unanimously. Mike Gallamore asked for nominations for vice president, Philip Montarsi nominated Mike Gallamore, Karen Harrison seconded, pass unanimously.

Lee Robbins explaining why only certain residents received notice in the mail, and years of discussion by the town council has been made about the issues with the current water system.

The Town Council then conducted a public hearing on the proposed waterworks rate increase and invited the public to comment. Discussion was made by residents and Steve Brock.

President Greg Nelson presented the council with Ordinance #418, an ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES OF THE TOWN OF PRINCE'S LAKES WATER UTILILY. Mr. Nelson made a motion to adopt Ordinance #418 as presented on 2nd and final reading. Troy Meadows seconded the motion and passed unanimously.

President Greg Nelson presented the council with Ordinance #419, an ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION AND INSTALLATION BY THE TOWN OF PRINCE'S LAKES, INDIANA, OF CERTAIN EXTENSIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE TOWN'S WATERWORKS UTILILTY, THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF REVENUE BONDS TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE PAYMENT OF COSTS THEREOF, AND THE COLLECTION SEGREGATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF THE REVENUE OF SUCH WATERWORKS AND OTHE RELATED MATTERS. Mr. Nelson made a motion to adopt Ordinance #419 as presented on 2nd and final reading. Philp Montarsi seconded the motion and passed unanimously.

Greg Nelson made a motion to adjourn. Philip Montarsi seconded the motion and carried unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 8:24 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 418

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES OF THE TOWN OF PRINCE'S LAKES WATER UTILITY

WHEREAS, the Town of Prince's Lakes, Indiana owns and operates a Water Utility;

WHEREAS, the Town Council for the Town of Prince's Lakes, Indiana (the "Council") is the governing board of the Town's Water Utility and as such sets reasonable rates and charges that produce sufficient revenue to:

- (1) pay all the legal and other necessary expenses incident to the operation of the utility, including:
 - (A) maintenance costs;
 - (B) operating charges;
 - (C) upkeep;
 - (D) repairs;
 - (E) depreciation;
 - (F) interest charges on bonds or other obligations, including leases; and
 - (G) costs associated with the acquisition of utility property under IC 8-1.5-2;
- (2) provide a sinking fund for the liquidation of bonds or other obligations, including leases;
- (3) provide a debt service reserve for bonds or other obligations, including leases, in an amount established by the municipality, not to exceed the maximum annual debt service on the bonds or obligations or the maximum annual lease rentals;
- (4) provide adequate money for working capital;
- (5) provide adequate money for making extensions and replacements to the extent not provided for through depreciation. *IC 8-1.5-3-8*;

WHEREAS, the Council last set the Town's Water Utility rates and charges by adopting Town Ordinance 389 on March 20, 2017:

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that the Town's water rates and charges, as set by Ordinance 389 are now insufficient;

WHEREAS, the Council has reviewed and considered a December 16, 2019 Water User Fee Study, prepared by Therber, Brock and Associates, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed rates and charges was properly noticed and held on January 7, 2020;

WHEREAS, notice of the public hearing was mailed to all customers of the Town's water utility occupying property located outside the Town's corporate boundaries.

ACCORDINGLY, be it ordained by the Town Council for the Town of Prince's Lakes as follows:

Section 1. The Rates and Charges shown on the Schedule, attached hereto as Appendix "A," are nondiscriminatory, reasonable, equitable, and just, and are necessary to produce sufficient revenue for the Town's Water Utility to:

- (1) pay all the legal and other necessary expenses incident to the operation of the utility, including:
 - (A) maintenance costs;
 - (B) operating charges;
 - (C) upkeep;
 - (D) repairs;
 - (E) depreciation;
 - (F) interest charges on bonds or other obligations, including leases; and
 - (G) costs associated with the acquisition of utility property under IC 8-1.5-2;
- (2) provide a sinking fund for the liquidation of bonds or other obligations, including leases;
- (3) provide a debt service reserve for bonds or other obligations, including leases, in an amount established by the municipality, not to exceed the maximum annual debt service on the bonds or obligations or the maximum annual lease rentals;
- (4) provide adequate money for working capital;
- (5) provide adequate money for making extensions and replacements to the extent not provided for through depreciation. IC 8-1.5-3-8.

Section 2. The Rates and Charges, as shown on Appendix "A," attached hereto, are hereby approved and adopted.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Council hereby authorizes and directs the appropriate officials and representatives of the Town to take all necessary actions to implement, bill, and collect the Rates and Charges, approved and adopted herein, beginning as soon as is practicable.

Section 4. Ordinance 389, and all other prior ordinances and parts of prior ordinances, to the extent they are not in conflict herewith, remain in full force and effect. Ordinance 389, and all other prior ordinances and parts of prior ordinances, to the extent they are in conflict herewith, are repealed as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

Introduced and adopted, on first reading, by the Town Council of the Town of Prince's Lakes, on the 16th day of December, 2019.

Passed and adopted, on second and final reading, by the Town Council of the Town of Prince's Lakes, on the 7th day of January, 2020.

All bills for water service not paid within 15 days from the due date thereof, as stated in such bills, shall be subject to the collection or deferred payment charge of 10% of the amount of delinquent rates and charges.

Temporary Users

Water furnished to temporary users, such as contractors, etc., shall be charged on the basis of the metered gallon rates hereinbefore set forth as estimated and established by the water superintendent.
